- If your research is clearly exempt, then you may request that the HASRC keep a record of your exempt research on file; complete and sign two copies of this form and submit both to the HASRC chair prior to beginning data collection; a copy signed by the HASRC chair will be returned to you and should be kept. Please attach a copy of any instrument (survey, questionnaire, test, and so forth) which will be used.
