College and Academic Counseling Committee Report – Julia

- 1. Julia was part of a college tour in California. She visited nine colleges over seven days.
- 2. She visited with students from IMSA who are now attending these schools
- 3. A total of 42 counselors were on the tour. Only 2 were from a public school, IMSA and the other was a public school in Westchester, NY.
- 4. The only counselor from Illinois and the Midwest was Julia
- 5. Sophomores Group meetings are finished and the next one is set for 30 January. At that meeting they will discuss course selection and then in Feb/Mar they will meet individually to complete questions regarding course selection
- Juniors moved the SAT testing date to March; meet with Juniors 16 Jan for college selection meeting (earlier than usual because of move up of SAT); registration date for March SAT is Jan 24

- a. Jan SAT date also at IMSA; June SAT at IMSA also
- b. Princeton Review to give juniors a practice test and then Princeton Review will provide follow-up discussion to go over the results,
- c. ACT test in April
- d. AP tests in May
- 7. Seniors processed 1,641 requests for transcripts (mostly for college applications)
 - a. Early action coming up Dec 10
 - b. Some schools give feedback directly to Julia
 - c. Most popular applied schools (in order) are U. of Illinois, Northwestern University, Univ of Chicago, Wash Univ, Case Western Reserve, Univ Illinois in Chicago, Stanford Univ, Cornell Univ., MIT, Duke Univ, Harvard, Yale.
 - d. Question was asked: is there a limit to the number of applicants to any particular college as is the case for some elite prep schools. CAC philosophy is that it is a family decision and it is not possible for CAC to enforce a policy of limiting applicants to any school. In the case of early action the philosophy is that by applying the student is truly dedicated to going if admitted and should be more selective, not just applying for early action to many schools.
 - i. Core purpose of IMSA is different than a prep school. IMSA sustainability is not in placement to elite universities the same as a prep school which is based on placement to top schools. Sustainability is in providing students with a means for lifelong learning and identifying schools that provide the best "fit" or "means" for achieving their goals.
 - e. College visits—CAC will start meeting with juniors in March to advise, and continue with Family sessions in June to meet for advice and resources and plans. There is much information available on line. CAC suggest the three p's program, place, and people are what generally drive the decision. The purpose of the visit is to see #3 -- people -- since program and place are already known through literature and internet. Serious visits should be done after April 1st.
